Course Title: RECENT DISCOURSES IN SOCIOLOGICAL THEORY

Section A-Descriptive Assignment Questions

1. Which theoretical perspective—Integrated Sociological Paradigm, Multi-dimensional Sociology, or the Micro Foundations of Macro Sociology—do you believe is most effective for adopting a micro-macro integrated approach to understanding society, and why?

Hint: Describe the theories of micro-macro integration and explain which one is most effective within the micro-macro integration paradigm.

2. What are the key promises and advancements in sociological theory brought about by modernism and late modernism?

Hint: Describe the major features of Anthony Giddens' and Alex Callinicos' theories, and explain how they contribute to new advancements in sociological theory.

3. How do Alex Callinicos and Zygmunt Bauman explain the complexities of modernity, and do you agree with their defense of it against postmodernism? Support your answer with observations on the changes occurring in modern life

Hint: Describe the major features of Zygmunt Bauman and Alex Callinicos' theories, and explain how they attempt to defend modernity against postmodernism.

4. In what ways does Althusser's theory expand upon classical Marxist theory? Reflect on the contemporary relevance of Althusser's ideas in analyzing societal structures and their reproduction.

Hint: Explain Althusser's theory and discuss how it expands upon Karl Marx's classical theory. Use examples from contemporary form of capitalism and reproduction to illustrate your points.

5. How does Derrida's theory of deconstruction inform your approach to analyzing and interpreting books, novels, or films?

Hint: Describe Derrida's theory of deconstruction and explain how it aids in the interpretation of texts.

Section B- Analytical Questions

1. Using Foucault's discourse analysis, conduct a study on the discourses on health by experts in Kerala's public sphere.

Hint: Examine how the concept of 'true' health practices is shaped through these discourses by analyzing debates on the credibility of homeopathy and Ayurveda in newspapers, magazines, and YouTube videos. Pay particular attention to how certain voices are included or excluded, and how the notions of legitimate and illegitimate medicine are constructed in Kerala's public sphere.

2. Is gender a biological reality or a social construction? Explain in the light of Judith Butler's gender theory.

Hint: Select five Malayalam movies of your choice or Malayalam novels and short stories and analyze how gender identity, femininity, and masculinity are portrayed. In light of these observations, examine how Judith Butler's Gender Performativity theory represents a major theoretical shift in gender studies.

3. Are we living in the modern era or the postmodern one? Explain this in light of Giddens' and Zygmunt Bauman's theories of modernity.

Hint: Conduct a study of the products you purchase from the market or online platforms like Flipkart or Amazon, as well as the changes in your food choices and the movies you regularly watch. Based on these observations, reflect on Giddens' and Bauman's theory modernity and analyze the new ways globalization has transformed our daily life.

4. Prepare a commentary on Bourdieu's theory of forms of capital

Hint: Apply Bourdieu's theory based on your observations of how the rich and poor live their lives in you locality, including the goods they purchase, such as premium cars. Also, observe educational institutions and public places like clubs to examine how different forms of capital operate in these settings.

5. What major trends have post-modern theories in sociology established, and how do these trends offer insights into society that classical thinkers, such as Marx and Durkheim, did not provide?

Hint: Carefully examine the theories of Foucault, Derrida, Bourdieu, and Judith Butler, and analyze how their perspectives help our understanding of social realities compared to classical thinkers. Illustrate your answer with examples, such as gender relations, interpretations of literature or cinema, new social movements, class relations, state power, or the caste system.

SET I– Descriptive

1. Caste determines social identity and it may translate to political power – Discuss how caste holds precedence in present day society in terms of social and political role.

(Hints: Caste assigned roles and division, caste reservation, vote banks, caste politics)

2. The agricultural sector saw an overhaul after the independence? Identify major changes and how did it affect the agricultural sector.

(Hints: Land reforms, Constitutional reforms, CDP, Green Revolution, Land policy)

3. Migration can be categorized according to its length and direction. Based on this, identify the types of migration taking place in the state of Kerala and assess its impact on the rural – urban dynamics of the state.

(Hints: Rural – Urban migration, Urban – Urban migration, Push forces, Pull elements)

4. Distinguish between Rural and Urban Sociology.

(Hints: Define rural and urban sociology, discuss the nature/scope of both, evaluate the academic spectrum of both in Indian society)

5. Discuss in detail the sociological implications of urbanization in India.

(Hints: Impact on Occupational and Class Structure, Religion, Kinship Network and Polity)

6. Identify one safeguard each for SC, ST & OBC, assess how effective it is and suggest how you would modify it for the better.

(Hints: Constitutional safeguards, Acts and Laws for specialized protection, identify one each for each community, assess how effective it is and suggest changes if needed)

7. Kerala has seen a transition from a joint family to a nuclear family, what are the social implications of this transition?

(Hints: Joint family, Nuclear family, change in family dynamics, social assessment of this change)

8. Identify the three laws that led to the Farmers' protest and assess the implication they will have if implemented and based on your assessment state whether it should be repelled or not.

(Hints: The Essential Commodities (Amendment) Act, the Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Act, and the Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Act)

9. "A city can be characterized sociologically as a permanent settlement of individuals from diverse social backgrounds that is reasonably large, dense, and dynamic", Based on this statement identify a city of your choice and state your reasoning for your selection and elaborate on its city-like characteristics.

(Hints: Define a city, characteristics, classify, and state your selections unique qualities that qualify it as a city)

10. Identify any one major slum in Kerala, analyze the problems faced by the inhabitants and provide suggestions for improving their living conditions.

(Hints: Briefly discuss what is a slum, the types and features of slums, and major problems in slums and correlate these to the slum you have identified)

1. Define communication, explain its types and discuss the importance of communication in personal and professional contexts.

Hint: Discuss communication, its types, functions, process and importance of communication

2. Analyze the impact of globalization on the spread of news and information around the world.

Hint: Examine the relationship between globalization and mass media, emergence of global media, media convergence and media imperialism.

 Compare and contrast the views of McLuhan and Baudrillard regarding the impact of media on society. Discuss how each theorist perceived the relationship between media, reality, and human experience, providing specific examples to illustrate your points.

Hint: Briefly outline the key ideas of Marshall McLuhan regarding media, focusing on concepts like "the medium is the message" and Jean Baudrillard's views on media, particularly his ideas on simulation, hyper-reality, and the role of signs in contemporary culture.

4. Critically analyze the role of media in social transformation, focusing on its impact on societal norms and values concerning women, youth, and children

Hint: Discuss the impact of media on youth, women, and children, highlighting both the positive and negative effects it has on societal norms and values.

Section B- Analytical Assignment Questions

SET I-Descriptive

1.Explain the political and economic structure of Kerala and discuss Naduvazhi system, Janmi-kudiyan systems.

Hint: Briefly explain the economic and political structure by focusing on how these systems were interlinked, with political power (Naduvazhi) and economic control (Janmi) shaping Kerala's feudal society.

2.Discuss the caste based inequalities existed in the Kerala society. Do you think that caste system is prevailing in Kerala society? Substantiate.

Hint: Explain both historical and modern aspects of caste, highlighting the progress made by Kerala as a state and the prevalence of caste system in contemporary Kerala.

3.Examine the role of religion in the socio-cultural formations of Kerala. Comment on the emergence of Bhakthi movement and advent of Christian and Islamic religions.

Hint: Emphasize how religion influenced Kerala's social structures, cultural identity, and reform movements and discuss the contributions of the Bhakti movement in challenging caste and the role of Islam and Christianity in shaping Kerala's plural society.

4.Assess the contributions of Thunjath Ramanujan Ezhuthachan and Hermann Gundert in the development of Malayalam language.

Hint: Highlight Ezhuthachan's contributions to popularising Malayalam literature and Gundert's role in standardising and modernising malayalam language.

5.Evaluate the land struggles in Kerala such as Muthanga and Chengara struggles. Do you think that these struggles have enrooted for rethinking existing inclusive policies.

Hint: Briefly discuss how both Chengara and Muthanga struggles revealed the failure of Kerala's land reforms especially dalits and adivasis.

SET II- Analytical

Explain the concept of Marumakkathayam, its origin and the reasons for the disintegration of the system with suitable examples

Hint: Discuss how Marumakkathayam worked, why it was suited for the earlier social structure, and the various legal, economic, and social factors that led to its decline.

1. Examine the historical evolution of religious pluralism in Kerala. Provide examples of how Hinduism, Islam, and Christianity have coexisted and influenced each other.

Hint: Highlight specific examples of festivals, cultural exchanges, shared spaces, and social practices that illustrate the harmonious coexistence of various religions in Kerala and discuss how these elements contribute to a unique social fabric that values diversity and mutual respect.

2. Compare and contrast Kerala Model of development with that of other states. Prepare a note on what do you see as advantages and comment on the challenges.

Hint: Highlight the strengths and challenges of the Kerala Model, such as its focus on human development and compare Kerala's growth with other states.


Hint: Examine the problems of return migrants to Kerala and analyse the government initiatives to address them.

- The descriptive assignment requires the learners to comprehensively explain the theories or concepts supported by relevant facts and examples. In contrast, the analytical assignment demands critical evaluation based on well-supported arguments, leading to informed conclusions.

Assignment Format

- The assignment should contain a title page, introduction, content (explaining theories or concepts for the descriptive set or analysing the theories and concepts for the analytical set), conclusion and bibliography.
- The assignment must be handwritten.

SET 1: DESCRIPTIVE

- Compare and contrast the classical psychoanalytic approach with the neopsychoanalytic approach to understanding personality. In your discussion, highlight the key principles, concepts and theories associated with each approach. Examine how these theories conceptualise the driving forces behind human behaviour and personality development.
- 2. Describe and compare various methods and techniques used in counselling. Discuss the underlying principles of each, how they are applied in practice and the effectiveness in addressing different types of client issues.
- 3. Discuss the various factors that influence the development of personality. In your response, analyse how genetic and hereditary, environmental, psychological and developmental factors interact to shape an individual's personality over time. Provide examples to illustrate the above.
- 4. Discuss the importance of assessment in counselling and its significance in the therapeutic process. Explore the distinction between assessment techniques and tools, providing specific examples.
- 5. Critically examine the ethical principles that guide the practice of counselling. Analyse how these principles are applied in real-world counselling scenarios, including the challenges and dilemmas counsellors may face in upholding these standards. Reflect on the role of ethical codes and professional guidelines in ensuring responsible and effective practice.

SET II: ANALYTIC

1. One of the most common misconceptions about counselling is that it simply involves giving advice or telling clients what to do. Reflect on this misconception and discuss how it contrasts with the actual role of a counsellor. In your response, explain the key principles of the counselling process and describe how a counsellor's approach goes

beyond merely providing advice to support clients in their personal growth and self-discovery.

- 2. Can you recollect your earliest experience of recognising yourself as a distinct individual? Is your 'self' the same as your personality? How would you relate the emergence of your 'self' with the development of your personality? Discuss the above and critically analyse how the various domains of development such as cognitive development, language development and emotional development influence the development of personality.
- 3. Engage in a conversation with a practising counsellor to gain practical insights into the counselling process. Based on this interaction, write a report outlining the key aspects of the counselling process, including the techniques, stages and goals. Examine how the stages of counselling discussed in the course compare with those applied in a real-world setting.
- 4. Someone might describe themselves as shy. Are they describing their personality, or not? Substantiate. Given the above, discuss in detail the conceptual layout (the concept, definitions, nature and elements) of personality.
- 5. Familiarise yourself with various assessment tools used in counselling. Identify and list two assessment tools each for depression, anxiety and personality. Describe the purpose of the tool, explain how it is administered and discuss the strength and limitations of each tool in capturing the relevant psychological constructs.
